



## FAMILY REUNION VISA CHECKLIST

**The application must be submitted at least 15 days before the intended travel date. Failing to do so will result in the application to be returned.**

1	<input type="checkbox"/>	<a href="#">National Application form</a> duly completed and signed.
2	<input type="checkbox"/>	One passport size color photo, white background, maximum 6 months old ( <a href="#">see specifications</a> );
3	<input type="checkbox"/>	A valid passport (and a copy) satisfying the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ its validity must be at least three months longer than the visa requested;</li><li>○ it must contain at least two blank pages;</li><li>○ it must have been issued within the previous 10 years;</li><li>○ it must hold a valid UAE visa.</li></ul> Damaged passports will not be accepted.
4	<input type="checkbox"/>	Copy of UAE Residence Visa valid at least 6 months.
5	<input type="checkbox"/>	Previous Schengen, USA, or UK visa copy.
6	<input type="checkbox"/>	Copy of the “Nulla osta” released by the Italian authorities (Sportello Unico per l’Immigrazione) within the last 6 months.
7		Copy of the Passport and Permit of stay of the person living in Italy.
8		<b>Invitation letter</b> signed by the person with whom the applicant is reuniting.
9	<input type="checkbox"/>	Documents proving the family relation with the person to be reunited with. Depending on the situation the applicant will have to provide different documents: <b>1) If the applicant is reuniting with a member of the immediate family (husband or wife) holding a permit of stay in Italy, the same must provide:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a) A family status certificate clearly mentioning the composition of the family (husband, wife and children). If the document is released by an Embassy/Consulate in the UAE the same must be legalized by the UAE MOFA and the Consulate General of Italy in Dubai. If the document is released from an authority not in the UAE, the same must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the Country where the document was released.</li><li>b) A marriage certificate clearly mentioning the names of both husband and wife. If the document is released by an Embassy/Consulate in the UAE the same must be legalized by the UAE MOFA and the Consulate General of Italy in Dubai. If the document is released from an authority not in the UAE, the same must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the Country where the document was released.</li><li>c) In case a minor is also traveling, the applicant must also provide a birth certificate clearly mentioning the name of both parents. If the minor is born in the UAE, the certificate must be legalized by the UAE MOFA and the Consulate General of Italy in Dubai. If the certificate is released from an authority not in the UAE, the same must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the Country where the document was released (<i>as an example: an Indian expat born in the UAE requires legalization from MOFA and The Consulate General of Italy in Dubai. An Indian expat born in India, must provide a certificate legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in India</i>).</li></ul> <b>2) If the applicant is a dependent child, 18 years old or above, the same can apply only if he/she has a condition of full disability. In this case the applicant must provide:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a) A birth certificate clearly mentioning the name of both parents. If the certificate is released the UAE, the applicant must request the legalization by MOFA and by the Consulate General of Italy in Dubai. If the certificate is released abroad, the certificate must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the Country where the document was originated (as an example: a certificate released in the UAE requires legalization from MOFA and The Consulate General of</li></ul>

		<p>Italy in Dubai, while a certificate released in India, requires to be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in India).</p> <p>b) Documents proving his/her condition of full disability.</p> <p><b>3) If the applicant is a dependent parent (mother or father) of a foreign citizen holding a valid permit of stay in Italy, the same can apply only if there are no other children in the UAE or in the Country of origin. In this case the applicant must provide:</b></p> <p>a) A family status certificate clearly mentioning the composition of <u>any member of the family</u> (husband/wife and children) <u>even if not living in the same Country</u>. If the document is released by the Embassy/Consulate in the UAE the same must be legalized by MOFA and the Consulate General in Dubai. If the document is released from a foreign authority not in the UAE, the same must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the Country where the document was released.</p> <p>b) A birth certificate of the daughter/son in Italy, clearly mentioning the name of both parents. If the certificate is released in the UAE, the applicant must request the legalization by MOFA and by the Consulate General of Italy in Dubai. If the certificate is released abroad, the same must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the Country where the document was originated (as an example: a certificate released in the UAE must be legalized by UAE MOFA and The Consulate General of Italy in Dubai, while a certificate released in India, must be legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in India).</p> <p>c) Proof of the financial dependency from the person residing in Italy or from any other daughter/son.</p> <p>d) If the parent is 65 years old or above and any of the children living in the UAE or in the Country of origin cannot take care of him due to serious health issues, official documents regarding the daughter/son health condition, duly legalized by the Italian Embassy/Consulate in the country where the document was released, must be provided.</p>
10	<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Documents regarding the financial situation in the UAE of the applicant:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Last 3 months pay slips (if any);</li> <li>○ Last 3 months bank statements;</li> <li>○ A valid international credit card accompanied by the relevant last 3 months card statements;</li> <li>○ Any other document that might help evaluate your financial situation in the UAE (i.e. other bank accounts, personal properties, investments, etc...).</li> </ul> <p><b>Bank Statement should be on a bank letterhead. Photocopies or online statements must bear the original bank stamp.</b></p>
11	<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>An international medical insurance covering the entire stay with a minimum of 30.000 € coverage and full and unlimited coverage for hospitalization. Emergency repatriation flight as well as repatriation of mortal remains must be included. Detailed table of benefit must be provided.</p>
12	<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Confirmed <b>direct flight</b> booking. During the Pandemic we strongly advise the applicant to book a direct flight in order to avoid any problems due to the possible implementation of additional access restrictions in the transiting Countries.</p>
