



EU FAMILY MEMBER TOURISM VISA CHECKLIST (v. March 2026)

The application must be submitted at least 15 days before the intended travel date. Failing to do so will result in the application to be returned.

1	<input type="checkbox"/>	Application form duly completed and signed.
2	<input type="checkbox"/>	One passport size color photo, white background, maximum 6 months old (see specifications);
3	<input type="checkbox"/>	A valid passport (and a copy) satisfying the following criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ its validity must be at least three months longer than the visa requested;○ it must contain at least two blank pages;○ it must have been issued within the previous 10 years;○ it must hold a valid UAE visa. Damaged passports will not be accepted.
4	<input type="checkbox"/>	Copy of a valid UAE Residence Visa.
5	<input type="checkbox"/>	Previous Schengen, USA, or UK visa copy.
6	<input type="checkbox"/>	A color copy of a valid passport of the EU citizen family member;
7	<input type="checkbox"/>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Marriage/Family status/Birth certificate (original and one copy).2. Certificates issued by an UAE Authority must be:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Legalized by UAE MOFA and by the relevant Italian Consular Office in the UAE.b. Translated in Italian by an officially recognized translator, translation itself must be legalized by the relevant Italian Consular Office;3. Certificates issued by one of the Schengen countries will be accepted only if multilingual, otherwise please refer to the following notes;4. Certificates issued by a foreign authority other than the UAE, must be:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. If issued in a Country signatory of the Hague 1961 Convention, certificates may be Apostilled.b. Otherwise, Certificate must be legalized by the relevant Italian Consular Office in the issuing Countryc. In any case, the Certificate must be translated in Italian by an officially recognized translator. Translation itself must be legalized by relevant Italian Consular Office; Italian nationals' spouses - whose marriage certificate has been already registered in Italy or in the Italian consular network as required by <u>DPR n. 396/2000</u> - are exempt from providing an updated version of the above-mentioned certificate. Instead, they are required to provide a self-declaration, signed by the Italian spouse pursuant to Artt. 46 and 47 DPR n. 445/2000, confirming the ongoing marriage status.
8	<input type="checkbox"/>	Declaration signed by the EU family member, stating either of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• that the applicant is travelling with the EU family member (signature must be provided in front of VFS officer)• that the applicant is reaching the EU family member. Failure to provide the above declaration will result in the applicant not being eligible for a visa fee exemption.
